

Book Discussion Guide

- 1. What do you think were the driving forces behind Bailey's depression, restlessness and bad choices?
- 2. Bailey is obviously a flawed character. What do you see as her greatest flaws? And why, if she is so flawed, does she make an endearing character to readers?
- 3. Who did you root for in the love triangle? Do you think Bailey makes the right choice in the end?
- 4. How do you see Rudy and Bailey's relationship changing in the future? What will it take for them to continue to love each other unconditionally?
- 5. Contrast and compare the relationship Bailey has with Rudy and Adam. Are there factors that are the same in both relationships?
- 6. The bond among Bailey, Rudy and Idamarie is a special one, but some might argue that it was actually holding Bailey, and even Rudy, back. What do you think?
- 7. It's clear that Rudy and Bailey get a down-to-earth mother figure in their friendship with Idamarie. What do you think Idamarie gets from her relationship with them?
- 8. Bailey's relationship with her mother is strained. Do you think Bailey is too hard on her family? Do you see hope for them to become closer?
- 9. How does Bailey's relationship with her father affect her interactions with the different men in the story?
- 10. A theme in the novel is that family doesn't have to define who you are. Do you agree? Can we really ever completely break away from our heritage?
- 11. How do you feel about how Texas and Colorado are portrayed in the novel? Do you see them as competing forces?
- 12. Sometimes, changing your geographic location can help you change your life. Do you agree with that statement?
- 13. Where do you think Bailey will 10 years from now? Texas or Colorado? (Or rehab!?)
- 14. Have you ever thought of just picking up and moving, trading one life for another? Do you think it is essentially an American dream compared to other cultures?
- 15. Did you feel Bailey grew over the course of the book in the right ways? Do you think she has freed herself from a legacy of bad choices?
